

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Get Ready for a Great School Year!

The Newport News team worked hard all summer to ensure a fantastic school year, and our students are already off to a great start! Our Dual Language Immersion (DLI) students in PreK through 5th grade follow the same curriculum as their non-DLI peers, with the added benefit of explicit instruction in Spanish literacy. Science, Social Studies, and Literacy alternate between English and Spanish, while Mathematics is taught in Spanish with English bridging lessons to provide access to content in both languages.




In middle school, our DLI students at Gildersleeve continue building their biliteracy skills. Science in Spanish is offered for grades 6, 7, and 8, while Social Studies in Spanish is available for grades 7 and 8. Additionally, students in grades 6 through 8 take a specialized Spanish Language Arts class designed to deepen their understanding of the language and improve their listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills. This program helps our students continue to grow as bilingual learners while further strengthening their biliteracy skills.

At Menchville High School, our students take an advanced Spanish class that prepares them for the assessment, which leads to the Seal of Biliteracy on their diploma. To earn the Seal of Biliteracy, students must demonstrate a high level of proficiency in listening, speaking, reading, and writing in both English and Spanish.

Our teachers are eager to partner with families to make this school year successful! Whether your child is in PreK, high school, or somewhere in between, we are all working together to provide the best educational experience possible. Please ensure your child arrives to school on time, stays for the entire day, and attends regularly when healthy. Excessive absences make it harder for students to keep up with content and can cause them to miss important skills.

In addition, we are excited to announce the continued growth of our new Dual Language Immersion sites at Denbigh Early Childhood Center and Katherine Johnson Elementary. This expansion began in 2022 with PreK students at Denbigh and Kindergarten students at Katherine Johnson. Last year, the program expanded to include 1st grade, and this year, we are proud to have expanded once again to 2nd grade. These new sites, partially funded by a DoDEA (Department of Defense Education Activity) grant, provide more students with the opportunity to develop bilingual and biliteracy skills at an early age, creating a strong foundation for future success.

Announcing The Path to Biliteracy: A New Way to Celebrate Student Achievements!

We are excited to introduce *The Path to Biliteracy*, a new recognition program for students in Newport News Public Schools' DLI program. This initiative allows students to earn badges as they complete key milestones in the DLI program and promote to the next grade level.

Each badge in *The Path to Biliteracy* represents an important step in our students' journey toward becoming bilingual and biliterate. Students can earn badges at specific points in their academic journey:

- Level One: Early Language Explorers Awarded to students for completing PreK
- Level Two: Building Biliteracy Bridges Earned after completing 5th grade
- Level Three: Navigating Across Languages and Cultures Given at the end of 8th grade
- Level Four: Mastering the Biliteracy Journey Presented to students who complete 12th grade, marking their achievement as they work towards earning the prestigious Seal of Biliteracy

We are also excited to announce that students who have already completed a level will retroactively earn that badge at their next promotion ceremony, in addition to the badge for their current grade level. For example, if a student completed PreK and is now in 1st grade, they will receive the Early Language Explorers badge at their next promotion, along with future badges as they continue in the program.

The Path to Biliteracy celebrates the hard work and dedication of our students as they develop the skills needed to thrive in two languages. This recognition program not only acknowledges their academic accomplishments but also reinforces the value of bilingualism and biliteracy in our global world.

We are proud to celebrate our students' achievements and look forward to seeing them earn these badges as they progress through the DLI program!





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
