- I went to a private school for a while and switched to public school and it was so much better. They had so many more things we could do and not just have to go to college, but I could learn how about more hands on skills.
- I really appreciate NNPS education system. The kids are likely going to school, because their teacher and environment is really nice. The friendly environment

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- makes them want to be there and cause a good education.
- The teachers at Palmer are very caring and understanding. The Start Program was a great experience.
- I like the morning snack at Greenwood. It is a great experience, especially for kids not able to provide breakfast.
- My kids love the field trips, but I wish they went to more different locations, but they do love the field trips.
- I love that my daughter learns though play at school. It really reinforces what the teacher teaches.

Tell me a story about your community...

- Neighbors look out for each other, helping each other, good communication and we have a diverse neighborhood. We have good and smart property manager who works with the Virginia Coop.
- My community is falling apart. We need more activities to keep us busy. My kids don't feel safe, I don't feel safe.
- We had a girl in crisis. She was suicidal, and the police were called. They helped her get counseling and did a very good job following up.
- When I want to play basketball, I have to go to a different complex, because it is not safe here. It is very dangerous. We have a beef with some of the other people in our neighborhood and don't want to end up fighting or getting shot. One child got caught in the crossfire while getting off the bus.
- I don't have many community activities, so I don't have a story. Only a bunch of kids hanging out on the street.
- The story takes place about 20 years ago, but it could still happen in today's communities. When I grew up on Talifero Rd, we had a neighbor by the name of Mrs. Talifero who took the initiative to do something positive for the children on the street. She organized a center in a small house on the street. Monday- Friday we did variety hands on arts and crafts. She also had physical recreation and the center gave free lunch and hayrides. I think this was great because someone thought about us as children. It has been a lasting and positive memory I have taken into adulthood. I suppose it means, we as a community don't have to wait for the "city" to do things for us. We can get together as neighbors and make a positive impact on ourselves, children, and community on our own.
- I move around a lot and my children miss school, because we rely on public transportation. One child goes to one school, because he has special need, and my other child another. Now they are telling me that we have an attendance problem and I am going to have to go to court.
- I would like for my child's teacher to build a community of better communication.
