You've come to the right place! With our five-year plan, you'll earn a bachelor's degree, then in the final year, you'll complete graduate-level professional courses and a 14-week teaching internship.

What you'll learn

- How to plan, deliver and assess instruction to meet state and district objectives.
- How to build a nurturing learning environment.
- How to be a professional through your interaction with students, their families and other educators.

MAT'S BENEFITS

MAT advisers work closely with you from your first day on campus to map your education studies.

Our partnership with award-winning Newport News Public Schools opens the doors to valuable experiences close to campus. You can tutor in Newport News schools while enrolled in the MAT program and even get paid for substitute teaching. We make overseas teaching experiences possible in Belize and Ireland.

The MAT program is accredited by the Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation (CAEP), and 48 additional states accept the Virginia teaching license.



CHOOSE YOUR FOCUS

You can earn a license to teach elementary school, secondary school, or special areas such as art, music, ESL, and Spanish (PK-12). Elementary and ESL teachers may major in any liberal arts or science discipline. Secondary 6-12 and PK-12 teachers in art, music, and Spanish must major in the areas they wish to teach. Teaching areas include visual art (PK-12), biology (6-12), chemistry (6-12), elementary (PK-6), English (6-12), history and social sciences (6-12), mathematics (6-12), music (choral or instrumental, PK-12), physics (6-12) and Spanish (PK-12).

OFF CAMPUS BUT STILL IN CLASS

You will observe vibrant classrooms and tutor and work with students in small groups. That adds up to 120 hours in schools, whether paid or as a volunteer.

Your 14-week internship will culminate with all the duties of a regular classroom teacher including lesson planning and delivery, grading and conferring with parents.

In the spring of your junior year, complete the formal application for the MAT, submitting two letters of recommendation, a professional essay and a resume.
