Dr. Nick Snead High School Band Conductor

Dr. Nicholas Snead currently serves as an Assistant Principal in Loudoun County. Dr. Snead previously served as an Administrator and Director of Bands at Powhatan High School in Powhatan, Virginia where he oversaw all aspects of the band program, directed the Marching Band, Wind Symphony, Symphonic and Concert Bands, Jazz Band, Concert Open Percussion, Beginning Band, and administered the Indoor Guard and Percussion Programs. Under his direction, all of his ensembles consistently received Superior ratings at VBODA State Concert Assessment, VBODA Marching Assessment, Jazz festivals, and finalists at AIA and WGI events.

The Powhatan Band Program under the direction of Dr. Snead was awarded the VMEA Blue Ribbon School Award five times, named a Commonwealth of Virginia Honor Band five times, and designated one of the Best Communities for Music Education by NAMM. Dr. Snead has been honored by his peers as Powhatan High School's Rising Star Award recipient in 2016.

Dr. Snead is a graduate of Longwood University, where he studied saxophone with Dr. Charles Kinzer, played in the Jazz Ensemble, Wind Symphony, sang in the Camerata Singers, and served as Chair of the University Judicial Board. Dr. Snead completed his Master's and Doctorate in Educational Leadership from Virginia Tech. In 2021, Dr. Snead completed the Next Generation Leaders Academy, a program sponsored by the University of Richmond designed for leaders in public education.

Dr. Snead holds membership in the Alpha Chi Chapter of Phi Beta Mu, International Band Fraternity, Virginia Music Educators Association, Virginia Band and Orchestra Directors Association, National Association for Music Education, National Band Association, Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, Virginia Education Association, Longwood University Performing Arts Council, and the Virginia Marching Band Cooperative where he serves as Treasurer.

Danielle Yonkers, a native of Atlantic City New Jersey, is a graduate of the prestigious Norfolk State University where she received her Bachelor's and Master's degrees in Music Education. She is also a graduate of the University of Richmond where she received a Post-Master's degree in Educational Leadership and Policy Studies. With over 20 years of teaching experience, Mrs. Yonkers began her teaching career in Halifax County North Carolina as the Director of Bands at Enfield Middle School and the assistant Band Director at Southeast Halifax High School. In 2007, Mrs. Yonkers helped to open Elko Middle School as the Choral and Orchestra Director. Shortly thereafter, Elko Middle became the first middle school in Henrico County to receive the VMEA Blue Ribbon Award, which is the highest award given to schools' music programs in the Commonwealth of Virginia. In 2010 she was granted the opportunity to open another school, Holman Middle School, as the Director of Bands. In 2022, Mrs. Yonkers returned to Elko Middle School as the Director of Bands and also serves as the Assistant Band Director at Highland Springs High School.

Mrs. Yonkers has received numerous superior ratings at the State Middle School Band Assessments and has served as an adjudicator for middle and high school concert assessments in both North Carolina and Virginia. She also served two terms as the VBODA District I Instrumental Music Representative. Mrs. Yonkers feels every student that steps into her classroom will succeed. She believes every student has the ability to learn something from her and she can also learn from her students. She stands by the thought of motivational speaker Dr. Tim Lautzenheiser, "It is not what you will do, it is not what you can do, but it is what you do do."

Dr. Miroslav Lončar Guitar Conductor Miroslav Lončar is an educator, performing artist, and composer for guitar, currently living and working in Northern Virginia. Dr. Lončar is the founder and artistic director of the Karlovac International Summer Guitar School in Croatia, the founder and conductor of Loudoun Youth Guitars, and the founder and president of the non-profit organization Aguado Guitar Concerts. Dr. Lončar started his music education in his native Croatia and went on to study in Austria, where he received his master's degree, and later in the United States, where he earned his doctorate. Miroslav Lončar has been performing on the classical guitar throughout Europe and the United States, mostly in the <u>Klasinc&Lončar</u> <u>Guitar Duo</u> with his wife, and with the Lončar Trio with their daughter Maya. Miroslav Lončar has been featured as a soloist with a number of symphony orchestras throughout the United States. He has recorded several albums including solo as well as collaborative ones with the Klasinc&Lončar Duo, Trio Bolero, the calypso group Kaiso, and others.
